





1ST CHURCH: EPHESUS

1st and 2nd Churches: Ephesus and Smyrna <u>Historical Aspect of Ephesus</u>

Ephesus, one of the 12 cities of Ionia (an ancient Greek district on the western coast of Asia Minor), located near modern Izmir, Turkey. As a port city at the mouth of the Cayster (modern Küçükmenderes) River, it was a major departure point for trade routes into Asia Minor. Known in antiquity for its sacred shrines, notably a famous temple (one of the Seven Wonders of the World) to the goddess Artemis, or Diana, the city was also an important center of early Christianity.


1st and 2nd Churches: Ephesus and Smyrna 1st Church: Ephesus

*Revelation 2:1-7.

1) Unto the angel of the church of Ephesus write; These things saith he that holdeth the seven stars in his right hand, who walketh in the midst of the seven golden candlesticks; 2) I know thy works, and thy labour, and thy patience, and how thou canst not bear them which are evil: and thou hast tried them which say they are apostles, and are not, and hast found them liars: 3) And hast borne, and hast patience, and for my name's sake hast laboured, and hast not fainted. 4) Nevertheless I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love.

- ❖5) Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent. 6) But this thou hast, that thou hatest the deeds of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate. 7) He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches; To him that overcometh will I give to eat of the tree of life, which is in the midst of the paradise of God.


1st and 2nd Churches: Ephesus and Smyrna Description & Knowledge of Christ

*Revelation 2:1,2.

- 1. He holds the seven stars (angels/messengers) and walks among seven candlesticks (churches).
- 2. Knows the works, toils and endurance of His followers (patience).

1st and 2nd Churches: Ephesus and Smyrna Commendation to the Church

- *Revelation 2:2,3,6.
- 1. They laboured; not weary. (Gospel to the World)
- Colossians 1:23. (See also Acts 8:4) If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled, and be not moved away from the hope of the gospel, which ye have heard, and which was preached to every creature which is under heaven; whereof I Paul am made a minister.
- 2. Tested supposed Apostles/teachers, found them liars.
- Acts 13:8. But Elymas the sorcerer (for so is his name by interpretation) withstood them, seeking to turn away the deputy from the faith.

- Matthew 24:12.(See 7:21-23) And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold.
- 2. Remove their candlestick.
- Matthew 5:15. Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house.

Daniel and The Revelation by Uriah Smith (pp. 365-6) Chap. 2 – The Divine Method of Prophetic Revelation


The Nicolaitanes.--...It appears that they were a class of people whose deeds and doctrines were both abominable in the sight of Heaven. Their origin is involved in some doubt. Some say that they sprang from Nicholas of Antioch, one of the seven deacons (Acts 6:5); some, that they only attribute their origin to him to gain the prestige of his name; and others, that the sect took its name from one Nicholas of later date. The latter theory is probably more nearly correct. Concerning their doctrines and practices, there seems to be a general agreement that they held to a community of wives, regarded adultery and fornication as matters of indifference, and permitted the eating of things offered to idols.

1st and 2nd Churches: Ephesus and Smyrna Counsel to the Church

- *Revelation 2:5.
- 1. Repent.
- Acts 2:38. (See also 1 John 1:9) Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.
- 2. Remember the first works.
- 3. Return to your first love and first works.


- *Revelation 2:7.
- 1. Eat from the Tree of Life in Paradise (Heaven).
- Revelation 22:1, 2 (See also Corinthians 12:2,4.)
 - 1) And he shewed me a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding out of the throne of God and of the Lamb. 2) In the midst of the street of it, and on either side of the river, was there the tree of life, which bare twelve manner of fruits, and yielded her fruit every month: and the leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations.



2nd CHURCH: SMYRNA

1st and 2nd Churches: Ephesus and Smyrna <u>Historical Aspect of Smyrna</u>

Founded in the 11th century BC by the Aeolians, a Greek people, the city was seized by the Ionians before 688 BC. Later in the 7th century BC, Smyrna was devastated by the Lydians, a people of Asia Minor. Antigonus I, king of Macedonia, restored the city in the 4th century BC, and subsequently it was fortified and improved by Lysimachus, a general in the service of Alexander the Great. Smyrna was conquered later by the Romans and subsequently became an early center of Christianity, referred to as one of the "seven churches" (see Revelation 1:11). *Revelation 2:8-11.

8) And unto the angel of the church in Smyrna write; These things saith the first and the last, which was dead, and is alive; 9) I know thy works, and tribulation, and poverty, (but thou art rich) and I know the blasphemy of them which say they are Jews, and are not, but are the synagogue of Satan. 10) Fear none of those things which thou shalt suffer: behold, the devil shall cast some of you into prison, that ye may be tried; and ye shall have tribulation ten days: be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life. 11) He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches; He that overcometh shall not be hurt of the second death.



Christian martyr: Christ or Diana?

1st and 2nd Churches: Ephesus and Smyrna Character of Church

- 1. Meaning of Smyrna: "Myrrh sweet smelling savour". (See Matthew 2:11).
- 2. Period: A.D. 100 323.
- 3. Era: Describes the church to the conversion of Constantine when the Roman Empire became Christian and Pagan persecution largely ceased.
- 4. State of Church: Corruptions began entering the church.

1st and 2nd Churches: Ephesus and Smyrna Character and Knowledge of Christ

- *Revelation 2:8,9.
- 1. Christ is the First and the Last.
- 2. He was dead and now is alive.
- 3. He knows the tribulation and poverty of the church.
- 4. Also He knows about their coming troubles.



The Resurrection of Christ.

1st and 2nd Churches: Ephesus and Smyrna Commendation to the Church

- *Revelation 2:9.
- 1. Rich in Heavenly goods.
- Matthew 6:19-21.
 - 19) Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal: 20) But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal: 21) For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

1st and 2nd Churches: Ephesus and Smyrna Commendation of Church

- 2. Withstood false Jews.
- Romans 2:28,29 (See also John 1:47)
 - 28) For he is not a Jew, which is one outwardly; neither is that circumcision, which is outward in the flesh: 29) But he is a Jew, which is one inwardly; and circumcision is that of the heart, in the spirit, and not in the letter; whose praise is not of men, but of God.

Reproof and Warning to Church

Jesus does not rebuke this church. It is the first of two churches that have no reproof.

1st and 2nd Churches: Ephesus and Smyrna Counsel to Church

*Revelation 2:10.


- 1. Do not fear the persecution.
- 2. Be faithful to the end.
- Revelation 12:10,11.
 - 10) And I heard a loud voice saying in heaven, Now is come salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of his Christ: for the accuser of our brethren is cast down, which accused them before our God day and night. 11) And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death.

The Great Controversy by E.G. White (pg 40) Chap. 2 – Persecution in the First Centuries

These persecutions, beginning under Nero about the time of the martyrdom of Paul, continued with greater or less fury for centuries. Christians were falsely accused of the most dreadful crimes, and declared to be the cause of great calamities, famine, pestilence, and earthquake. As they became the objects of popular hatred and suspicion, informers stood ready, for the sake of gain, to betray the innocent. They were condemned as rebels against the empire, as foes of religion, and pests to society. Great numbers were thrown to wild beasts or burned alive in the amphitheaters. Some were crucified; others were covered with the skins of wild animals, and thrust into the arena to be torn by dogs. Their punishment was often made the chief entertainment at public fêtes. Vast multitudes assembled to enjoy the sight, and greeted their dying agonies with laughter and applause.


Tribulation Ten Days.--As this message is prophetic, the time mentioned in it must also be regarded as prophetic. Since a prophetic day stands for a literal year, the ten days would denote ten years. It is a noticeable fact that the last and most bloody of the ten great persecutions of the Christian church continued just ten years, from A.D. 303 to 313, beginning under Diocletian. It would be difficult to make an application of this language on the ground that these messages are not prophetic; for in that case only ten literal days could be meant. It would not seem improbable that a persecution of only ten days, or only a single church, would be made a matter of prophecy; and no mention of any such case of limited persecution can be found.

❖ Revelation 2:11

- 1. Crown of life.
- 2. Shall not be subject to the second death.
- Revelation 20:6,14. (See also Matthew 10:28)
 - 6) Blessed and holy is he that hath part in the first resurrection: on such the second death hath no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with him a thousand years.
 - 14) And death and hell were cast into the lake of fire. This is the second death.
